

Dr. Clyde Oyster

Dr. Clyde Oyster, who was among the first faculty members at the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry (UABSO), passed away on Sept. 8, 2016.

According to UABSO, Dr. Oyster was revered as an outstanding teacher, pioneering retinal researcher and esteemed author. His textbook, "The Human Eye: Structure and Function," is considered a landmark publication and is still being used at schools and colleges of optometry. He and his wife, the late Dr. Ellen Takahashi, were instrumental in the early success of UABSO and the creation of the Vision Science Graduate Program.
